ORLICZ MEDAL

Władisław Orlicz (1903-1990) was one of the most eminent among Polish mathematicians of the twentieth century, best known for work in functional analysis. A student of Stefan Banach in Lvov, he moved on to the University of Poznań to establish and lead for many years another brilliant school of mathematics.

The Orlicz Medal was first given at the Centennial Celebration held in 2003, and in 2005 it was established as a continuing free-standing award.

The first laureate was B. Mandelbrot.
